## 7. Background of the Organization:

Samadhan was started in October 14, 1987 as a local level club with the name of “**Mujgunni Jubo Samobay Samity**” which was trying to contribute different welfare activities in the localities. After wards disaster in 1988, provided support on emergency response to the flood affected peoples of Monirampur and Keshabpur upazilas under Jashore district considering humanitarian aspects with the assistance of local elites and community people. Later, those clubs renamed as **Jana Kollyan Sangstha (JAKOS)** considering the community requirement to functioning as NGO & obtained registration from the Department of Social Welfare on June 13, 1991, and accordingly started to social work at community level. After that, organization tries to rising fund from different level. Firstly, the organization mobilized the community to organize and build grassroots organization to establish their rights, dignity, fraternity in the society, capacity building and identifying local resources, access to Government services to render their betterment as resources and consciousnesses are the prime obstacle towards socio-economic development of the underprivileged people. Later, emergency response, construction of roads & schools and try to achieve acceptance, trust and believe from different level. In that connection the organization has been implemented different project with the support and technical assistance by various donors & GoB agencies.

On May 10, 1997 organization got registration from NGO Affairs Bureau with the name of “**Jashore Jana Kallyan Sangstha (JAKOS)**” cause behind another organization was registered under the Bureau with same name. Organization has been running smoothly with some efforts; but due to the name of organization were meaning area based and created some obstacles. In that situation organizational General Committee decided to change the name as “**Samadhan**”. The English version of the Bengali words “Samadhan” is organization for make solution of human being, emancipation of the people i.e. the people are free from poverty, disparity and exploitation.

## 8. Organizational Goal and Objectives:

**Goal:** Sustainable Socio-economic development of the target groups of its working areas.

### Objectives:

- To make organization and its beneficiaries self-reliant by providing need based technical and financial support.
- To create employment opportunities for the poor and ultra poor people both rural and slum areas on both farming and off-farming activities by providing technical and financial support.
- To create access to services available in local level for poor and marginal people.
- To establish dignity and respect of the women, adolescent, children, people with disability and Ethnic.
- To develop long-term strategic plan for sustainable socio-economic development.
- To develop networking with international, national, and local level agencies in respect of local issues of wellbeing through advocacy.
- To prevent early marriage, polygamy, dowry and violence against women and children.
- To provide essential preventive and curative service on health, population and nutrition.
- To establish water and sanitation facilities in communities, especially arsenic free safe water.
- To prevent RTI/STD/HIV-AIDS by providing adequate education & knowledge.
- To increase organic farming practice and forestation to reduce environment pollution.
- To make people aware about democracy, rights and good governance.
- To establish rights of the children by protection of child labor.
- To operate micro finance program by local or foreign individual or institutional donation or credit. To reduce loss of life and wealth in pre, during & post disaster.

### 13. Expertise of Samadhan

Samadhan has good track record working with GOB, national and international development agencies and multilateral/bi-lateral donors as a development partner and services providers since 1987. Over the years from its inception period Samadhan has gained many technical expertise which are given below. Expertise of Samadhan is as follows.

- Expertise in working with national and international donors' agencies, local administration, local government, local and regional GoB/NGOs & Community leader on different development issues.
- Samadhan maintains coordination & liaison with local administration, local government agencies/ disaster management committee & community leaders in implementation of disaster preparedness, management, emergency evacuation, relief & rehabilitation activities.
- Expertise to undertake project for disaster affected mass people to working in flooding, waterlogging, salinity and other context of natural calamities.
- Have expertise on implementation of climate change, environment protection, health, rights and violence, water and sanitation and food security based projects over the south-west region.
- Having expertise in community risk assessment and formulation of local disaster risks reduction action plan and following action plan implementation of different risk reduction options by involving local government, local administration and other GoB/NGO officials.
- Expertise on survey by using PRA tools, Ethnographic monitoring, case study etc.
- Have expertise in organize and conduct training needs assessment, training, workshop, sensitization meeting, community mobilization meeting, seminar, media campaign, development IEC/BCC materials, folk song, theater, EPI services, MCH services and carrying out different awareness activities.
- Have expertise in writing presentations, periodic reports, case study, survey reports and monitoring both Bengali and English.
- The organization has IT expert on ICT programming, especially Certificate in computer application and Certificate in data base programming which is affiliated with the Bangladesh Technical Education Board.
- Expertise on Rights based programming especially for women, children and person with disability.
- Have micro credit expertise in operation of micro finance programs.
- Expertise in advocacy & social mobilization in social issues like dowry, women rights, election & voter registration awareness campaign, Eve teasing, various disease prevention, life skill learning and preventive & curative support for human being etc.

### 14. Experiences of organization in Education Program.

Organization has long and progressive experiences to implement on Non formal education program. The program is initiated through Parenting and Shishu Bikash Kendra. Now we reviewed our implementation strategy and have taken decision each of the center will be started with the Baikalic Child Education Support Center and Pre-schooling and parenting. Initially this center was managed through community contribution with assistance of Samadhan. We don't build any structure for this purpose. From 2014 Samadhan have launched the primary education in 35 schools for class one and two students who are deprived of the opportunity due to the unavailability of skilled teachers on the vulnerable areas. All enrolled students of class one and two have successfully completed their academic year and moving forward, this year 936 students of these 35 schools have started their class one and two education. All students from Samadhan schools have passed the year change primary exam which is required for the students who have completed class 2 education. While the school final result stood at 100 % pass rate. This year, average student's attendance increased to 97.37% from 96.87% and drop out has been reduced to 3.06% from 4.38% as well Codes of Ethics, Dignity and Child rights are resulting in building the confidence and character of the children. This program has been implemented by the ENRICH/ Samridi project with the Financial and Technical assistance of PKSF. Samadhan has selected the paid teacher for the center operation with the assistance of respective areas staff. Supervisor (Education) and Social Development Officer facilitated parenting, pre-schooling and Baikalic Child Education Support Center. Samadhan will provide basic & necessary training to the teacher for session conduction, and also sports and cultural events through competition on arts and drawing, reciting poem and rhyme as well as provided material and scholarship to promote quality education for adolescent and children

## 15. Financial Management

To ensure transparent management of finance Samadhan has skilled manpower in finance section. The accounts department of Samadhan maintains and controls the entire finance and accounting system. It follows standard accounting system using double entry cash and ledger books. Samadhan maintains separate bank account for each of project funded by donors and uses the sign of two signatories against each of bank account. It has regular practice of prepare monthly and quarterly financial report to the donors needs. Samadhan audit its finance and accounts by hiring government authorized and PKSF enlisted audit firm annually and has internal control through its system of internal audit by a regular internal auditor. Samadhan usually carry out its internal audit each and every project, interventions and activity generally with in six-month interval and incase of need it has been done any time by breaking the half yearly auditing practice considering it's importance and justification, Samadhan has appointed qualified and experience auditing staff.

## 16. Management Structure of Samadhan:

The general committee of Samadhan consists of 21 members are the supreme authority of the organization. The General committee meets once in a year and has authority to approved yearly program plan and budget, planned activity and review the activity done, organizational performance and audit report. Members of the General committee elected and formed Executive Committee consists of 06 members along with female for a period of 3 years. Members of the executive committee have the authority to approve the activities, budget, annual audit report, approval of different policies of the organization and monitoring the ongoing programs or project over areas.

Now the trend of organizational scale-up both geographical and financial is still satisfactory. The field level offices are running well under direct leading of respective Manager, Regional Manager/Project Coordinator with the help of different sector head as representative of head office. The Senior Management Team (SMT) is playing vital roles to smooth operation of program(s) and as well as to ensure prior financial support to make the staff proactive in program implementation with prior accountability, responsibility and transparency in all aspect.
